## Sport Award Committee

Each year a sport award committee will be formed consisting of:

- Sport Coordinators
- LAC Health & Physical Education
- Deputy Principal - Head of Secondary, or a nominated staff member

This committee is responsible for selecting recipients for all major College sport awards:

- College Sport Colours
- Year 7 – 12 Sport Awards
- Year 12 Sports Person of the Year (Outstanding Contribution to College Sport)

## College Sport Colour

A College Colour is awarded to a student to recognise his/her outstanding contribution and ability in Sport at John XXIII College. The major focus of the award is participation in college sport teams. Individual awards and sporting performance is recognised through MVP awards for NAS and at presentation nights for Rowing, Netball and Rugby.

### **College Colours**

- a. Junior Colours (Year 7 - 9)
- b. Senior Colours (Year 10 - 12)
- c. College Honour

Note; Awards must be attained within the year levels stated. e.g. A Senior Colour cannot include sport or performance from year 9.

### **The Award**

**Junior Colour** – embroidered white towel with College emblem and badge to be worn on college blazer.

The towel reads: “Junior Sport”

**Senior Colour** – embroidered white towel with College emblem and badge to be worn on college blazer.

The towel reads: “Senior Sport”

**Honour** – embroidered gold towel with College emblem and badge to be worn on college blazer.

The towel reads: “Senior” or “Junior” “Sport Honour”



### ***Sports Recognised***

NAS Sports  
ACC Carnival Sports  
Champion Schools Sports (SSWA)  
SSWA sports that are one day carnivals  
Rowing, Rugby and Netball Clubs

### ***Award Ceremony***

A special full school assembly will be held once or twice (preferably) a year.

### ***Selection Process***

- i) A student must seek a nomination for a Sport Colour (Appendix 1).
- ii) The Award Committee shall give final approval of recipients.

### ***Award Criteria for Junior and Senior Colours***

The recipient must have displayed:

- a positive attitude and commitment to team and College sport program
- attendance at trainings where appropriate
- respect for the coaches, teachers and umpires involved with the team
- a sustained involvement in sport over a minimum **two** years
- **attained 80 points as listed in the College Colour Points Allocation Table. (Appendix 2)**

### ***Award Criteria for College Honour***

The recipient must have displayed:

- received College Colour, junior or senior colour as listed above.
- **attained a 125 points as listed in the College Colour Points Allocation Table. (Appendix 2)**



## Year 12 Sportsperson of the Year

### Recognised at Speech Night

This is a prestigious award, which sits alongside major Speech Night awards such as Dux of the College. It can be a male or female, and in some years may be both.

### Criteria

The recipient(s) will have:

- attained a high level of performance in at least one College sport
- contributed to other College sport, outside their main sport, and in particular House carnivals
- represented the College in a range of sports from Year 7 to 12.
- displayed attributes of commitment, sportsmanship, leadership and being a positive role model

### Nominees

Nominations will be made for this award as follows: (Appendix 3)

- nominees will be called for from PE/Sport staff and House coordinators
- students in year 12
- the final award may be received by one or two students in any one year
- the Sport Award Committee will decide on the recipient(s), with the approval of the Deputy Principal / Principal

The students name will be inscribed on the Sport Award Board in the College Hall.

## Membership of Major College Teams/ACC Sport

All students that attend an ACC Carnivals will receive a metal bar to recognise the year and sport of participation. This can be worn on the lapel on the left hand side of the college blazer.

Students who have been a member of the College Swimming, Athletics or Cross Country ACC teams for six continuous years (year 7 – 12) will be awarded an embroidered towel at the Year 12 final assembly.

The towel reads:           “Swimming”  
  or           “Cross Country”  
  or           “Athletics”

For students from the Mary Ward program;       “PARA Sport”

It is possible for a Year 12 student to receive two or even three towels in their final year.



## NAS Sport Awards

At the conclusion of each NAS season the following awards are given:

- i) Most Valuable Player (MVP) award to one student per team (a small trophy)  
Team coaches organise the voting for this award, with the final decision being made by the team coach/manager.
- ii) A flag (provided by the ACC) to recognise each premiership team
- iii) An individual medallion to each team member of a premiership team

These awards are presented at Junior and Senior assemblies at the conclusion of the summer and winter NAS seasons.

Students that represent a NAS team in summer and winter of a year will receive a metal bar to recognise the year that this occurred. This can be worn on the lapel on the left hand side of the college blazer.

Students who have been a member of a College NAS team in summer **and** winter for six continuous years (year 7 – 12) will be awarded an embroidered towel at the Year 12 final assembly.

The towel reads: “NAS SPORT”

- Participation does not need to be in the same sport
- AFL in year 11/12 and year 9 will count towards NAS participation

Team/Honour	Points	Description
ACC	10	Compete in an event at an ACC carnival. Swimming, cross country, athletics. 10 points per team
NAS	10	Attend and participate in all fixtures. 10 points per term, summer and winter
Rowing	7	Membership and participation in John XXIII rowing club
Rugby	7	Member of college rugby team. Year 7/8, 9/10 or First XV. Must play at least 50% of fixtures
Netball	7	Membership and participation in the John XXIII netball club
Hockey	5	Participate at the ACC hockey or be involved as per team lists
Sailing	5	Participate and represent the college
Water polo	3	Participate at the SSWA water polo carnival
Triathlon	3	Participate at the SSWA triathlon carnival
House Carnival – Champion boy/girl	5	Champion boy or girl at House swimming, cross country or athletics carnival
House Carnival – RU Champion boy/girl	3	Runner up champion boy or girl at House swimming, cross country or athletics carnival
NAS MVP	5	Receive a NAS Sport MVP award in summer or winter sport
ACC All Star team	5	Be selected in the ACC All Star team for swimming, cross country or athletics
ACC Swimming top 3 in division 1 event	5	Finish 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2 <sup>nd</sup> , 3 <sup>rd</sup> in division 1 event at ACC swimming carnival
ACC Swimming winner in division 2 event	3	Finish 1 <sup>st</sup> in division 2 event at ACC swimming carnival
ACC Athletics top 3 in division 1 event	5	Finish 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2 <sup>nd</sup> , 3 <sup>rd</sup> in division 1 event at ACC athletics carnival
ACC Athletics winner in division 2 event	3	Finish 1 <sup>st</sup> in division 2 event at ACC athletics carnival
ACC cross country top 20	10	Finish in the top 20 competitor of their age category at ACC Cross Country Carnival
ACC cross country top 50	5	Finish in the top 50 competitor of their age category at ACC Cross Country Carnival
