Dear Parents, Students and Friends of John XXIII College

It has been a wonderful week for Australia this week, as the name of Mary of the Cross was added to the Litany of Catholic Saints. I had the privilege of attending the canonisation in Rome and as is integral to such experiences there was plenty of time to reflect and ponder. Much of the story telling in Rome was of the extraordinary battles and hardships that Mary MacKillop faced in establishing Catholic Education in the remote and rural areas of Australia. This is still a cause for celebration today. The Catholic system in Western Australian for example is still the biggest provider of education services in the Kimberley and other remote areas. The Josephite sisters were gracious in their praise of their collaborators in ministry. Significantly for us the Loreto's and Jesuits were among Mary MacKillop's closest friends and advisors.

It is not hard to love being in Rome but quite apart from its many charms, for me to be there as an Australian, Catholic Woman was very significant. Mackillop's story is 'our story' and many emotions were stirred by the sounds of our didgeridoos, the sight of the Redgum Cross and the constant echo of Australian conversation around the ancient St. Peter's Basilica. It was like the Vatican had become our local parish church!

As it was the weekend of our First Holy Communion at the College, I took with me medallions for each child. The medallions journeyed with me to Mass at the Vatican, which was celebrated at the John XXIII Altar. Pilgrims from all over the world held out their beads and medals for the Pope to I had so many medallions, a women in the crowd thought I was selling them and offered to buy one! I said, No, they were already assigned to 60 very special young people in Perth.

I conclude with this fine tribute to Mary MacKillop by Fr. Ross Jones SJ who

Chaplains Comments

Last Sunday was a great day for all of us to rejoice in the life, holiness and service of Mary MacKillop. It has been reported that there would have been over 8,000 Australians in St Peter's Square that morning attesting to the sanctity of Mary MacKillop. The opening prayer at the beginning of the Canonisation Mass summed up Mary's life so well, "God of all blessings, you revealed in Mary MacKillop, a woman sensitive to the rights and dignity of every person, regardless of gender race or creed. Help us to value each person. Help us to respect different cultures faiths and peoples. May we learn from Mary to overcome prejudice and fear". That strong injunction still resounds to all Australians especially our young who sang last Monday in our College Chapel, in full throated ease, "Never see a need without doing something about it". May Mary continue to bless, nurture and strengthen our faith.

The Parable of the Pharisee and the Publican in next Sunday's Gospel, targets some people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone. The Pharisee illustrates the attitude of those who can only bolster their own self image by putting down others. For such people life is a competition in virtue. God assesses the results and issues the prizes. Prayer is an opportunity to keep God informed about one's own successes and also about the shortcomings of others, in short a caricature of life. The Publican, or the tax collector stands down the back simply pleading God be merciful to him a sinner. Jesus points out that this one, who came to God's house in his own eyes a sinner, went home with God's favour.

There is double verdict recorded in the parable which could offer some comfort to many people today who find themselves or their loved ones, for example their children caught in situations judged objectively "sinful" on more traditional thinking whether in the area of sexuality, or marital involvement or professional occupation. In this complex world, loyalties often run in several directions. The application of general moral rules and norms to individual lives requires sympathy and pastoral understanding of the pressures of and burdens most people have to bear. The parable suggests, that in God's view at any rate, often does not run along conventional lines. The divine impulse is always towards acceptance, mercy and liberation, because all things are possible with God.





Homily given on the Day of Invitation 24th September 2010

A woman dreamt she walked into a brand new shop in the market place and to her surprise found God, behind the counter. "What do you sell here"? she asked. 'Everything your heart desires' said God. Hardly daring to believe what she was hearing, the woman decided to ask for the BEST THINGS a human being could ask for, "I want PEACE of MIND, LOVE and HAPPINESS & WISDOM & FREEDOM FROM FEAR" she said and then "not just for me for everyone on earth". God smiled "I think you got me wrong my dear, we don't sell fruit here. Only seeds" The mustard seed in today's parable does not focus on the smallness of the seed. Jesus uses the mustard seed as it is native of Palestine, just as the grevillea is native of Australia. The farmer seems to act with a casual abandon, by throwing the seed in the soil. What the intentions were, we do not know. The farmer scarcely meant to provide roosting places for the birds of the air, but that is what happened. Wild and free, they took advantage of his casual gesture. Friends there are something wild and free about the Kingdom it reflects the exuberant generosity of God. The birds of the air, the lowly and the disreputable take advantage of it. The respectable, like the synagogue Jewish leaders cannot cope.

How do I see another person? Do I see primarily an ethnic, cultural, social occupational Tag? Or do I get beyond the surface and see a fellow human being? This God seed is nothing but the immanent God locked up in our heart. How does germination take place? When something, or someone touches our outer circle of life. Adulthood begins in the walking away and love shows itself in letting go.

As Michael McGirr, a former Jesuit said it so beautifully, "For most of you, parenthood will be the door through which you pass to maturity. Parenthood is the most generous thing most people ever get around to doing. It is so rewarding, especially for those who are confined to their self importance. There is no point when you are dealing with a three year old in the middle of a full blown tantrum in a shopping centre, trying to console yourself with how many degrees you have from uni or how much you've earned in your last job. None of it will count for much. Your children will be the best teachers you ever have. They will try to teach you, among other things how to forgive your own parents. I hope you sleep well. I hope you are never afraid to sleep alone. I hope you read books and not just screens. I hope you write letters by hand now and again. I hope, when the times come that you are good bosses. I hope you sink deep roots. I hope that some of the people who love you now will still be around and love you when you are ninety. (I hope that some of the other people who love you then would be impossible to now imagine".)

Friends, no matter how difficult life changes and shapes, remember we are one choice away from

starting to live a better life, so discern well and choose well. When Keating, in the "Dead Poets Society" stood up on his desk, he asks "why do I stand up here?". One student suggests, "To feel taller". Keating replies " I stand upon my desk to remind myself that we must constantly look at things in a different way" As Christians we are invited to think BIG, seize the day, seize each other with new ideas, great visions and enthusiasm and a love that enables everyone to capture their dream. Focus on the things you love. Be curious, find new ideas, believe you can make a difference, play your strength and continuously learn. As God requested of Mary our mother, "Are you willing to bring me to birth in your own life? May our response be "Let it be done according to your will."

HEALTHY FOOD AND DRINK CHOICES

Children's energy needs for a busy day at school require them to eat a variety of foods. Factors that determine the amount children eat include age, sex and physical activity level. Children will have the best chance of getting all the nutrition they need if they are offered a variety of tasty and healthy foods every day which reflect the Dietary Guidelines for Children and Adolescents.

Over their schooling life children can consume up to 2500 meals. Therefore it is crucial that these meals are nutritious, whether brought from home or purchased from the school canteen. All meals should reflect healthy food choices.

Suggestions when making lunches at home:

- Choose a variety of foods
- Include bread, wholegrains, rice, pasta or noodles
- Include milk, cheese or yoghurt
- Include some meat, fish, chicken, eggs
- Go for 2 (fruit) and 5 (vegetables)
- Choose water as a drink
- Keep 'junk' food away from school

Some healthy snack ideas are:

- Rice cakes and reduced fat cream cheese
- Fresh fruit pieces and yoghurt dip
- Plain popcorn
- Small tub of yoghurt
- Cheese stick or triangle
- Muffins with fruit
- English muffin and cheese
- Fruit bread
- Scone plain, fruit or pumpkin
- Pikelets
- Small sandwich
- Crispbreads and spread
- Wholemeal crackers and cheese
- Keep food fresh and safe to eat by packing a frozen drink or an ice brick.
