What the manager does after he receives notice is reducing the debts of the master which is opportunistic. He cancels his own cut because he reckons that it will be more advantageous, when he is out of work and too weak to dig and too ashamed to beg, he will have the goodwill of people who may be able to help him for what he has done, because he acted sensibly, he has not clung to his wealth but used it to win goodwill that will serve him into the future.


going each year. When we attack the Church for the prime land and fine buildings, we have to remember our Christian commitment to the poor: outside the United Nations Organisation and Governments, the Catholic Church is the largest provider of education, health, welfare, personal assistance and the Third world development in the world.. We have been trying to serve God, not money, for two thousand years and from the earliest times, Catholics have loved and served the poor so faithfully, that they were ready to live and die for them.

None of this excuses us from the direct challenges in today's Gospel. We all know how seductive money is and how quickly greed can throw our moral and spiritual compasses off course. In moral theology, however, intention is critical and even money, seductive as it is, can be, and is, put to good service in God's kingdom. It's always a question of where the heart is.

This weekend, many will rejoice in the Beatification of Cardinal John Henry Newman to be performed by Pope Benedict XVI at Birmingham, England on 19th September 2010. One of the profound changes that effected a new direction in Newman after many years of vacillation was the moment when he left the Church of England and entered an English Catholic Church dominated by obstinate families who have sustained their faith through centuries of persecution and civil disabilities. Newman entered both an English and European Catholic Church where religious, spiritual and theological authority remained significantly dispersed among bishops, priests and laity. The following poem Newman wrote amidst this turmoil that spurred him on through those turbulent days of Anglican years into Victorian English Catholic Church, evokes a personal journey which he found lonely though religiously satisfying.

Lead Kindly Light, amid the encircling gloom, Lead me Thou on!
The night is dark, and I am far from home, Lead Thou me on!
Keep Thou my feet, I do not ask to see the distant scene; one step is enough for me. I was not ever thus, nor pray'd that Thou shouldst lead me on; I loved to choose and see my path, but now lead Thou me on! I loved the garish day, and spite of fears, pride rule my will: remember not past years. So long Your power hath blest me, sure it still will lead me on, o'er moor and fen, o'er crag and torrent, till the night is gone; and with the morn those angel faces smile which I have loved long since, and lost awhile.



City Of Nedlands Sponsorship of Youth Initiatives Fund

The purpose of the fund is to recognise and encourage the initiatives local young people are taking to participate in and contribute to the community. The fund encourages youth participation in a wide range of socially positive activities, based on the following:

- that participation in the community is in itself of value
- that participation in the community by young people, in particular, is to be valued and encouraged.

The City acknowledges the importance of recognising the positive interests and achievements of young people and encourages the pursuit of these interests within the community. In this way, the City works towards creating and reinforcing positive youth role models. In its leadership role, Council demonstrates, through its Youth Initiatives Fund, the value that community leaders place on young people's initiative and positive community involvement. The function of the fund is not primarily one of financial subsidy; rather, it is one of recognition and encouragement, and the creation of a positive youth culture, in which initiative, achievement and community involvement are valued.

Support from Council will be provided in the form of a small grant, subsidising participation in the eligible project, event or activity.

Eligible Applicants

- Young people living within the City of Nedlands

- aged between 12 and 21 years, or
- Organisations providing services to young people living within the City of Nedlands and aged between 12 and 21 years.
- Grants are limited one per financial year for each applicant. Therefore a successful applicant cannot reapply within the same financial year.
- Applicants must have satisfactorily acquitted any previous grant or grants received under the Fund, in order to be eligible to reapply.

Eligible Projects

- Projects eligible for funding support will be those events, projects and activities that provide an opportunity for youth participation in the wider community and support their artistic, cultural, community, educational, professional, technological, sporting, recreational, personal and/or social development. Projects or activities that have commenced before the application is assessed will not be eligible for funding. To ensure assessment of application before the event, applications must be submitted at least 4 weeks prior to the event.
- To be considered for sponsorship the youth project, event or activity should fit under one of the following categories:
 - Arts and Culture.
 - Sport, Recreation and Leisure.
 - Other.

Guidelines

1. Grants cannot be spent on capital items.
2. Funding will be provided to a maximum of \$250 per applicant.
3. The combined amount allocated to the categories of Arts and Culture plus Other will be at least greater than the amount allocated to the Sport, Recreation and Leisure category.
4. Young applicants are encouraged to write the applications themselves.
5. The City of Nedlands must be acknowledged in any publicity associated with the event.
6. Grant acquittal reports must be provided within three months of the completion of the project, and include a financial report.
7. Should the report not be provided within 3 months, Council may request the refunding of the grant.
8. No more than four applicants will be granted sponsorship from the same organisation in one financial year.
9. No more than four applicants will be granted sponsorship from the same event in one financial year.

The successful applicant will be required to submit 2 colour photographs of the event and grant the City of Nedlands permission to use them publicly.
