13% of our students achieved an ATAR of 95.00 or above, placing them in the top 5% of the state

36% of our students achieved an ATAR of 90.00 or above, placing them in the top 10% of the state

64% of our students achieved an ATAR of 80.00 or above, placing them in the top 20% of the state

League Tables

I have written this report earlier this year and before the League Tables are published. My comments therefore are equally applicable regardless of where we rank.

- All League Tables should be read with caution.
- Distortion in the League Tables this year may be more pronounced than ever this year because of the half-cohort of students.
- Some Colleges restrict eligibility of students to pursue an ATAR, therefore increasing the percentage of high scores in their total. John XXIII College allows a very comprehensive range of students to attempt an ATAR.
