In the State Finals of the Tournament of Minds, John XXIII College had been very dominant winning two of the four titles. As a result, the teams were invited to the National Finals in Darwin last weekend.

It is with enormous pride that I share with our College Community that our Language Team presented the most imaginative, clever and engaging solution. Their challenge was to change fact into fiction. They used the Swine Flu and weaved it into the story of the 3 pigs and the expression, "Pigs might fly" (a swine flew!) This team is now National Champions. Our Maths Engineering Team had to construct a machine capable of catapulting an object and having it land face up on a higher level. They did this successfully and wrote a very convincing script to support their solution. They received high honours (or runner up) in their category. This double act of prize winners was not achieved by any other College in the country. The best and brightest young thinkers from Australia, New Zealand and Hong Kong were in the Tournament.

Congratulations to the teams, facilitators and especially Mrs Judith McLean for her commitment to this enrichment activity, her inspiration and generosity.

## Chaplains Comments

In the Book of Wisdom there is an emphasis of the great distance between God and the rest of creation, including human beings, nonetheless, the Creator loves all that exists and is in fact, the 'lover of life'. Little by little God corrects those who offend and sets them back on the path of life. In the Gospel Jesus interacts with a person in need, usually a person in the margins of society, either by reason of health, social status or moral failing. This week, Jesus meets up with Zaccheus.

What, then about Zaccheus? Jesus is passing through Jericho and everyone is out to see him. Zaccheus the tax collector is more eager than everyone else but faces a double barrier. He is so small of stature that he cannot see over the crowd, and as one who plies a despised and resented occupation, no one is going to let him through to the front. So like many individuals in Luke's Gospel who are really seeking salvation, he does something extravagant, foolish, over the top: like a curious boy, he climbs up a tree. It is hard not to see a comic touch when Jesus stands beneath the tree and bids Zaccheus to come down and be his host that day. The joy with which Zaccheus welcomes Jesus into his house is a sure signal of being on the way to salvation. Salvation is not something purely for the future. It begins here and now as Jesus puts 'Today, salvation has come to this house'. It is to seek out, find and incorporate within the community, the excluded and the lost, the rich tax collectors like Zaccheus experiences the saving mission of Jesus.

The primary difficulty in accepting ourselves and valuing our individuality is the false belief that to become holy, or useful or happy, we have to become someone else or become perfect. The mother who cares for her children may

insight into Aboriginal Culture, how to live life to the full and what is important in life. This was our first blessing.

With this new perspective we volunteered in the Tom Price Youth centre working with the local children in the afternoons and preparing for an amazing Fete. Face painting, nail polish, bracelets, footy targets, bucket of grime, water target, minute to win it games were just a few of the activities that were enjoyed by the Tom Price and Paraburdoo children, not to mention the Year 11's.

Mazza and Nazi were two important role models who taught us a lot about the community and life in general. After three days of preparation, fun and enjoyment, we were taken around Tom Price by an Aboriginal Elder who taught us about the land.

Our next destination was beautiful Karijini where we worked with the Department of Environment and Conservation and visited many of the breathtaking gorges. Reflections on our experiences were an important part of everyday and allowed us to challenge our own thinking and set goals for our life based on the lessons learnt and the inspiring people we met.

We arrived safely home, with a new perspective about our country and life, not to mention new friends. It was an enjoyable experience that will not be forgotten.



## South India Pilgrimage

25<sup>th</sup> September – 9<sup>th</sup> October

2010 brought a new destination for the John XXIII College Pilgrimage program, travelling to Sr Selvi's (and Fr Gaeten's) homeland, of Tamil Nadu in South India.

There were 9 students and 3 staff who covered a vast area of the southern province of India. From the densely populated, bustling and often manic cities of Chennai (Madras), Trichy and Madurai to the southern tip of the continent where 3 oceans meet and some of Ghandi's ashes are kept (Kanyakumari), to the beautiful mountainous areas of Kodaikanal.

We were hosted by the Jesuit's in Chennai at Loyola College, at a Girls School and Hospital in Madurai and at Sacred Heart College in Kodaikanal who work with the outcast and oppressed in society regardless of religion. We were also looked after by the Servite Sisters in Trichy who run a hospital, leprosarium and HIV clinic for children and also at a school for blind children where the students greeted us with music, song, dance and smiles.



The highlight was for our students, playing and interacting with the Indian children. Seeing the smiles and witnessing the joy on the orphans, HIV and blind children's faces as well as our pilgrims was certainly something that will live with me and I'm sure the students for the rest of their lives. In our prayers we remember all those incredible people with whom we were privileged to meet in order to have the strength and resources to continue their good works with those most in need and also for our very own Sr Selvi who stayed in India to be with her sick father.


# Parents of Year 10 and 11 Students

## WHY EAT BREAKFAST?

Breakfast refuels the body with vitamins, minerals and energy needed for a busy morning's activities. When we do not eat breakfast we are more likely to feel restless, unable to concentrate, lack energy, suffer headaches and nausea.

It is important to encourage children to eat breakfast. A good night's sleep followed by breakfast in the morning helps children stay active and concentrate at school. It also means your child is less likely to get too hungry during the morning.

Don't forget how important your example is. Let your child see you making time to enjoy breakfast every day.

Here are some healthy breakfast ideas:

- Heart tick cereal and low fat milk
- Porridge
- Wholemeal or multigrain bread or toast
- Fresh fruit salad
- Fresh or stewed fruit and yoghurt
- Toast toppings, such as baked beans, eggs, cheese or spreads
- Omelette with tomatoes, mushrooms, and spinach.
- Fruit smoothie with low fat milk or yoghurt
- Muffins or crumpets

Group members remained in year level groups for the first two Communities of Inquiry and then for the final two discussions students were mixed up. The questions our students discussed were;

- Is faith reasonable?
- Is beauty purely subjective?
- Do we own our bodies?
- Why obey laws?

The John XXIII Team consisted of: Miranda Rooney, Will Paparo, Daniel Hunt, and Alastair Mory. Our students made an outstanding contribution to the night.

There was a short break between the first two and the final two discussions. Points were assigned to individual students and used to work out team scores and individual scores. A trophy was awarded to the winning school at the end of the evening and medals awarded in various categories. The annual John XXIII Philosophy Essay Prize was awarded to Year 9 Carmel School student Yaron Fisher. Yaron wrote an outstanding response to the question:

What sort of person do you need to be to live a 'good life'? This is the third year John XXIII College has awarded the prize. The essay competition attracts entries from students from many West Australian schools.
