Chaplains Comments

Life after death, in one form or another is a common belief of most of the major faiths of the world. The ancient Greeks, Romans and Egyptians all had detailed mythologies about life and death. For the most part, any concept of what occurred after death revolved around images of an underworld of torment and misery. In the book of Maccabees one might find the readings this weekend, off putting, where the young men quite as bold in the face of death as the narrative suggests. Is there a touch of fanaticism here, a literal embrace of a better life beyond death, the sort of thing all too familiar today, can lead to suicide bombings and atrocities?

Genuine martyrdom is always an affirmation not a denial of life. People of faith are prepared to surrender their lives not because they despise or belittle present human existence but because some values are so essential to human existence that they are, in fact worth dying for. In this case what the Macabees brothers are affirming in their readiness to die is a value in the Torah, that reflects the powerful belief in the fidelity and power of God even beyond death.

In Jesus' times not all parties of Judaism welcomed this belief, the Pharisees affirmed it while the Sadducees denied it. The quibble derives from the prescription of the law of Moses, whereby a man is required to raise offspring for a brother who has died. In the unlikely event, of all the seven husbands predeceasing the woman, will she not find herself in the risen existence, wife to all the seven! The quibble rests in the assumption that life after death would simply be a repetition of life in the present time.

This flaw in the argument is still alive and strong in much popular religious imagination, enables Jesus to lead us into two clarification in the risen life one enjoys: the immunity to death and enjoy the gift of children of God . Since no one dies anymore there is no longer any need for procreation hence no need for marriage, the institution designed to supply it. Jesus is not downplaying the institution of marriage denying that faithful marital relationship in this life has no resonance in the life to come, rather Jesus responds to the Sadducees on their our terms and refuting their bases that their whole idea of death as an ending, by saying that resurrection involves a preparedness to contemplate God in a different way, all people are alive, whether on earth or in the resurrection. It is God who has given us what we are and has set the limits to our existence. In middle age we become more conscious than ever before of that providence. Childhood and adolescence and young adulthood are all, almost by their very nature, deeply touched by works righteousness, as if we could , by using all our gifts, buy time and save ourselves and defer any thought of there being a limit. Our lives are finally judged according to limited possibilities. We are free to live and love and learn in confidence that the God who ordained the boundaries of life will accept our finite completeness.



Health Information

Allergy Awareness

The College has several students who have severe allergic reaction to nuts and other allergens. This reaction is called **Anaphylaxis**. It is a severe, rapidly progressive allergic reaction that is potentially life threatening and requires urgent treatment. The most common allergens in school aged children are peanuts, tree nuts, eggs, cow's milk, fish and shell fish, wheat, soy, sesame and certain insect venom (particularly bee stings)

The College has Anaphylaxis Guidelines which implement practical strategies to minimise the risk of exposure to known allergens for our allergic students. John XXIII College is an "allergy aware" school, the College can never totally eliminate the risk of an anaphylaxis and we cannot guarantee a totally allergen free environment. The key to prevention of anaphylaxis in schools is knowledge of the student who has been diagnosed as at risk, awareness of allergens, and prevention and avoidance of exposure to those allergens.

As a preventative measure could we please ask you to protect the students in our College who are at risk of anaphylaxis by:

- Not sending food to school which has peanuts or tree nuts (e.g. hazelnuts, cashews, almonds) in the ingredients list.
- Teach your child to respect children who have food allergies.
- Teach your child not to share **food**, drink, food utensils or containers with anyone.
- Encourage your child to wash their hands before and after eating.
- Ask your child to get help immediately if their allergic schoolmate gets sick.
- Explaining to your child that teasing an allergic schoolmate is bullying and could be life-threatening.

If your child has a severe Food Allergy:

- Teach your child not to share food, drink, food utensils or containers.
- Teach your child to wash hands before and after eating.
- Food for your child should be supplied from home
- If students with food allergy in primary school are allowed to make a canteen purchase the parent of the student with food allergy should check the order or visit the canteen and check suitable safe foods prior to the child making any purchase or order.
- When a child with a food allergy in primary school has a lunch order could parents ensure their food allergy is **written in 'red'** on lunch bag.
- If your child has a food allergy, teach them not to have foods that may trigger their allergy. If they are unsure what ingredient is in a food, they should not eat it.

Health Information contd.

- Parents are advised that your child should carry their adrenaline autoinjector on them when age appropriate to do so.
- It is recommended that students with severe food allergies wear a medic alert bracelet/necklet.
- Educate and empower your child to manage his/her allergy.

The Lynn Scholarship

The Lynn Scholarship was established to provide financial assistance to students in the Archdiocese of Perth who might be deprived of an upper secondary education in a Catholic school because of the economic or social circumstances of the family.

To be eligible, the student must currently be completing Year 10 at a Catholic School and intend to complete years 11 and 12 at a Catholic school. The value of the scholarship will be up to \$500 per annum and is payable for two years.
