## Chaplains Comments

Among the frightening things said by Christian leaders in the USA following the bombing of the World Trade Centre was that "God turned away from America because we have turned away from God and that God sent these acts as a wakeup call for us to live righteous lives and return to Him. One went as far as to confidently assert that, September 11 tells us we are living in end times. We all have different reactions to shock and grief. Why is this happening to us? When tragedy strikes on any scale, be it a tidal wave, cyclone, hurricane, earthquake or other natural disasters, someone declares 'the end is nigh'. The truth rarely gets in the road of the doomsday story. Sadly for us they usually invoke today's Gospel to support their case. The good news for us is that we are still waiting for the end of time. The good news for doomsday prophets is that one day they are going to be right.

We know from a variety of documents around the time of Jesus that the people of Palestine thought the world was soon coming to an end. Because those who proclaimed the Gospel in word and deed, who work for justice and a more humane life for all, are overthrown, cast into prison and 'disappeared', are all grounds for dismay, disillusionment, loss of faith, are always there. The discourse is for our time as much as for early generations of believers.

When bad things happen to good people, when they happen to us, we have choices. We can give in to desolation, depression and despair. This is what Ignatius calls desolation, "it is darkness and disturbance in the soul, attraction to what is low and of the earth, anxiety arising from various agitations and temptations". Some of us make a lifelong career out of it. This is understandable and tragic. Or we can choose to hope.

Christian hope is not about a pie in the sky when we die. It is not about putting on a happy face, come what may. Interestingly one of the

## John XXIII College Magis and Summer Design 2011

Since 2005, in the third week of January each year, old girl Sophie Giles from the Faculty of Architecture, Landscape and Visual Arts at The University of Western Australia and Dr Annette Pedersen have been running a very successful design studio for Year 12 secondary students from schools across WA. The studio is designed to give Year 12 students an academic extension experience well beyond their school experience. They are faced with the very challenging problem of solving design problems, learning to work with new computer design tools and ultimately drawing and then constructing a model of their design concepts. This all takes place in the Faculty of Architecture, Landscape and Visual Arts over one week and culminates with an exhibition of the student work. The students are treated as university students and need to work well beyond their comfort zones. While the studio gives students a taste of the discipline of Architecture, it also provides them with very stimulating intellectual experiences and is a wonderful, positive beginning for year 12. This year more than ten of our Year 11 students have enrolled in the 2011 Studio. Interested parents and staff will be able to view their work in the Faculty on 20 January 2011 from 2.30pm.

## ICT Strategy Plan

For several months, John XXIII College has been involved in a process of information-gathering as we seek to develop a plan for the future of ICT. Meetings with key stakeholders were recently followed by online surveys of staff, students and parents. The 275 student and 450 parent responses have provided much valuable data. Of especially great value were some of the detailed responses to the open-ended opportunities for comment.

The ICT committee spent most of last Monday digesting this data and formulating a set of 8 goals for the next three years. Specific strategies to achieve these goals were then developed. Further work is now needed to clarify some of these strategies, design implementation timelines and allocate tasks to key personnel. We hope to have a final draft of the ICT Strategy Plan ready for consultation in the next couple of weeks.

Over the next few weeks, I will present some of the more interesting facts we gleaned from the surveys.

# Health Information

## FACTS ON ALCOHOL

Alcohol is a central nervous system depressant – not a stimulant as many people think. Depressant drugs affect concentration and coordination, and slow the person's response time to unexpected situations. Alcohol is absorbed directly into the bloodstream through the stomach and the small intestine. Food in the stomach slows down the rate at which alcohol is absorbed, but does not prevent intoxication or drunkenness.

**How alcohol leaves the body:** the liver breaks down about 91 percent of alcohol, and a small amount leaves the body in urine, sweat and the breath. The liver can only work at a fixed rate, getting rid of about three quarters of a **standard drink (one that contains 10 grams of pure alcohol)** an hour. Sobering up takes time, and cold showers, exercise, black coffee, fresh air or vomiting will not speed up the process. Someone who drinks a lot at night may still have a high concentration of alcohol in their bloodstream the following day.

Alcohol has been identified as the major drug of concern for the West Australian community, yet getting drunk is often accepted as a 'normal' part of the Australian drinking culture.

Although alcohol-related problems are sometimes seen as a youth issue, the kind of drinking behaviour that leads to problems involving young people is often a reflection of what's already accepted as 'normal' in the community.

Parents and other family members play an important role in the development of young people's attitudes and behaviours towards drinking, and in helping our community adopt a culture of safer drinking with less alcohol-related problems.
