Chaplains Column

Fr. Hans Kung is the President of the Global Ethic Foundation and Professor Emeritus at Tubingen University, Germany, writes in the latest Tablet, dated 6th March, against Celibacy, following the enormous loss of face in the Church in Germany and Ireland on the clerical sex-abuse cases. The first erroneous assertion is that sexual abuse by clergy men has nothing to do with celibacy. Objection! It cannot be denied that such abuse can also be found in families, schools and in churches without the celibacy rule.

A look at the New Testament, makes it clear that Jesus and Paul practised celibacy in exemplary way for the sake of the ministry but they allowed full freedom in this matter to each individual. Peter and the other apostles were married men and their ministries did not suffer. For many centuries, this remained the matter of course rule for bishops and priests and in the Churches of the East. The Roman celibacy law contradicts the Gospel and the venerable Catholic tradition. It should be abolished.

Secondly the Celibacy rule did not exist during the first millennium, and introduced by monks, who freely choose celibacy. Pope Gregory VII, against vigorous opposition of clergy from Italy, and Germany, promulgated the decree. Does the Pope not recognize the word of the Lord, 'Let anyone accept this who can', Matt 19:12. The consequences put great constraints and overburdened the pastors. What would be the best solution to the problem of recruiting future priests? Quite simple; abolition of the celibacy rule, the root of these evils and the admission of women ordination. The bishops know this but have not the courage to say it in public.

In this final week of Lent, Jesus calls us to a life of freedom and wants us to stop doing destructive things that get us into trouble in the first place. It does not matter if it is drinking, gambling, eating, working, stealing, sexual dysfunction, being into pornography, being violent at home, or any other type of obsessive compulsive behaviour, there is little point in being sorry for the consequences of our weakness and not changing the pattern of behaviour that leads us to ruin each time. Jesus bestows great dignity on the woman charged with adultery, being condemned to death but even more so he knows that it does not have to be like this so challenges her to turn her life around.




Survey




