



# All Shook Up!

Dear Parents, Students and Friends of John XXIII College

I want to make two comments in this newsletter. They are polar opposites of pride and disappointment.

Firstly, let me express the collective pride the John XXIII College community feels towards the young cast and crew of "All Shook Up!" This years production was a wonderful showcase of singing, dancing and comedy. Telling a Shakespearean tale set to the music of Elvis Presley was always going to be a great challenge. Under the masterful direction of George Tsakisiris and Toni Strong, the students have overcome all the obstacles through hard work, talent and a capacity to work together. The show had great dance routines, wonderful solo and chorus vocals and laugh—out—loud comedy. The setting, props, wardrobe and make up were all professionally delivered through the cooperative efforts of students, staff and parents. We all can feel very proud of the young people (and our wonderful staff) who put their heart and soul into "All Shook Up". We wish them a very well deserved rest now the season is finished.

I would very rarely use the newsletter to express disappointment but I have decided today to comment on an issue of great significance and concern. I was visited on Thursday by two very professional and concerned policeman. They wanted to express their concern at the number of young people from the Western Suburbs that they continue to observe abusing alcohol, drugs, trespassing and acting in a disorderly fashion. They were visiting school to ask for our support in getting the message out there that young people are making very poor decisions about their own safety and with a significant disregard to the reputation of their families and Colleges. We can not be complacent and believe our students are not engaging in these criminal behaviours. The Police were keen to get the message to parents that they should be very vigilant about where their children are at night. There are ample opportunities for students to gather at night in the parks, schools and bushland of our suburbs. These locations are dangerous and often lead to very poor group behaviour.

It is a great source of disappointment to me that the very clear message we continue to deliver of the dangers of alcohol and drugs are being

ignored by some students and parents. As a result of this visit we have undertaken to facilitate more information sessions.

I particularly draw your attention to the "Party Safe" workshop being hosted by Shenton College on the 5th May. (see notice on page 3 of this Newsletter)

Together, let us seek justice.

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
# Around the Primary

## Health Information

### MEDICATION:

If a parent requests the nurse to administer medication to their child, they must complete a Medication Request Form, this is available from the nurse. The medication must be in its original container or packaging and clearly labelled with the following:

- Name of medication
- expiry date
- Childs name
- dose
- time to be given

If a student is required to carry and self-administer medication while at school, only a single measured dose for one school day can be brought onto the College premises. Medication must be carried on the student or locked in that student's locker.

- Students with asthma should carry their reliever medication with them at all times.
- Students who have anaphylaxis are advised to have their epipens with them at all times.
- Students who have documented anaphylaxis and are involved in after school activities eg, sport, drama etc, must carry their epipens with them.
- Students who have other medical conditions requiring medication or treatment and are involved in after school activities, eg, sport, drama etc must ensure they have their medication/treatment with them at all times.

**HEAD LICE:** As a preventative measure could parents please check their child/ren's hair regularly for head lice. Please inform class teacher or nurse if your child has head lice. For information about head lice, go to [www.health.wa.gov.au/headlice](http://www.health.wa.gov.au/headlice).

## Chaplains Column

On the Good Shepherd Sunday Gospel, Jesus identifies himself so closely with the Father that he tells us that they are one not just close but actually one. To know Jesus is to know the Father. Remember Jesus doesn't bring us closer to the Father. Jesus actually puts us directly into contact with God the Father, removing all distance between us. Our relationship with Jesus is an invitation to share in the life of God. The gospel is exploiting to the very limit the richness of the image, picturing the relationship between the believing community and the Lord as sheep and Shepherd. When sheep get lost and stolen, the shepherds are not strong. The Christian community need not fear because the ultimate shepherd is in fact God.

Anzac Day falls next Sunday most appropriate for this day of remembrance of mateship and self sacrifice, both the Good Shepherd of the gospel and the vision of the Apocalypse with the throng of those who have been through the great persecution and washed their robes white in the blood of the Lamb are evocative. Our Dawn service, silence, singing, intercessions, decorations and the gunfire breakfast can take account of Anzac Day without any compromise to the Easter Feast.

An extraordinary display of theatre, song and dance was presented at our annual college musical ALL SHOOK UP, which did take some of us to the good old days of rock and roll bringing together great talent and soulful rendition to the fore. Kudos to the entire crew!

Finally, a word about a fellow Jesuit, congratulations to Jamie Calder SJ, whose Ph D in Psychology was conferred at Macquarie University, NSW on Friday, the 16<sup>th</sup> April. 
