## Health Information

### HEART WEEK 2 May to 8 May

Heart Attack warning signs aren't what you think. Symptoms vary and they may not always be severe. Some people do not experience chest pain at all. The Heart Foundation's 2009 HeartWatch survey found that only 12 per cent of people would recognise symptoms such as jaw, neck, back or shoulder pain as a warning sign of heart attack. This is why, during Heart Week 2010, the Heart Foundation will urge all Australians to better identify the warning signs of heart attack.

Warning signs could include (you may have just one of these symptoms or combination of them):

- **Discomfort or pain in centre of your chest**
- **Discomfort in these parts of your upper body:** Arm(s), shoulder(s), neck, jaw, back
- You may have a choking feeling in your throat. Your arms may feel heavy or useless.
- **You may also experience other signs and symptoms:** feel short of breath, feel nauseous, have a cold sweat, feel dizzy or light-headed.

### WHAT TO DO

- **Stop** – Immediately stop what you are doing and rest.
- **Talk** – If you are with someone, tell them what you are feeling.
- **If any of your symptoms:**
  - ▶ Are severe
  - ▶ Get worse quickly
  - ▶ Have lasted 10 minutes
  - ▶ **THEN CALL 000 (triple zero) OR 112 (from mobile phone)**
  - ▶ **ASK FOR AMBULANCE. DON'T HANG UP. WAIT FOR ADVICE FROM THE OPERATOR.**

## Chaplains Column

In the United Nations Organisation, there is a Meditation Room planned and created in 1957 by Dag Hammarskjold. I had spent some meditation time there after a tour of the place. Last year, the then Secretary General, wrote the following, "We all have within us a centre of stillness surrounded by silence. This house dedicated to work and debate in the service of peace, should have one room dedicated to silence in the outward sense and stillness in the inner sense". People of many faiths will meet here and for that reason none of the symbols to which we are accustomed to in our meditation could be used. However there are simple things which speak to us all with the same language. We have sought for such things and we believe that we have found them in the shaft of light striking the shimmering surface of solid rock.

The stone in the middle of the room reminds us also of the firm and permanent, in a world of movement and change. The block of iron ore has the weight and solidity of the everlasting. It is a reminder of that cornerstone of endurance and faith on which all human endeavours must be based. The material of the stone leads our thoughts to the necessity for choice between destruction and construction between war and peace. Of iron, man has forged swords, of iron he has made his plough shares; of iron he has constructed tanks, but of iron he has likewise built homes. The block of iron ore is part of the wealth we have inherited on this earth of ours. How are we to use it?

The shaft of light strikes the stone in a room of utter simplicity. There are no other symbols; there is nothing to distract our attention or to break in on our stillness within ourselves. When our eyes travel from these symbols to the front wall they meet a simple pattern opening up the room to the harmony freedom, balance and space.

There is an ancient saying that the sense of a vessel is not in its shell but in the void. So it is for this room. It is for those who come here to fill the void with what they find in their centre of stillness". Dag Hammarskjold 1957.

Ignatius Loyola gifted the world with a spirituality that seeks to discover God in all things. During this Easter season we are invited in the centre of stillness in our lives, and through silence, to find God somehow present in all times, places and people and even in our void. As the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins put it: "The world is charged with the grandeur of God" and the Holy Spirit is that "dearest freshness deep down", drawing each of us gently "to love one another, as I have loved you".


